THEMES	DESCRIPTION	EXAMPLES
Theme 1: Google	The use of search engines, such as Google, to find information on the internet	"Googleing" "Looking it up on the internet" "Searching stuff in Google" "It's easy to find websites" "Google has information"
Theme 2: General Info	Finding general information and basic facts about a topic	"It is a well known place so lots of information will come up" "You can find easy facts" "basic info e.g. where is it located at? size of it?" "There is many resources all over place to find information"
Theme 3: Specific Info	Finding more detailed information about a specific topic	"The causes of poor water quality. This part of the topic was the easiest because their were numerous types of causes and each had a large amount of information to help me."
Theme 4: Finding images	Finding images, which are related to the topic	"Finding pictures" "The images that relate to this topic" "Looking for photos of the Swan River"
Theme 5: Taking Notes	Finding key points and taking notes about relevant information presented in a resource	"Writing Notes"
Theme 6: Bibliography	Creating an accurate bibliography, using an online bibliography generator	"The Bibliography, because you go onto bibliography generator on moodle and that helps you a lot"
Theme 7: Forming Questions	Formulating focus questions and sub-questions on a topic	"The focus questions"
Theme 8: Nothing	Not finding anything easy to do	"It's all hard work" "Nothing" "Don't know"
Theme 9: Other		"Putting the information in my own words" "Finding a reliable source"
